Lions Head-Pike Bay Charge



Founded by Methodists in 1883

and 1889, respectively, this charge sits about half way up the Bruce Peninsula, with Lions Head on the Georgian Bay coast, and Pike Bay a couple of miles from Lake Huron. The Lions Head congregation of approximately 90 shares a building with St. Marks Roman Catholic church. The ownership of the building and fund-raising are also shared. The Pike Bay congregation has about 40 attendees. Rev. Heather Davies is in her second year of ministry with these congregations. The charges' life is enriched in summer by the presence of campers and cottagers.

World Day of Prayer

Friday, March 4, 2011 1:30pm

Did you know that SJR belongs to the Women's Inter-Church Council of Canada (WICC)? WICC began in 1918 when women representing the Anglican, Congregationalist, Methodist and Presbyterian women's missionary societies met to discuss "united prayer and action and a stronger voice in national questions." This meeting led to the first national Day of prayer in Canada on January 9, 1920; this event became the World Day of Prayer in 1922.

Today WICC is an independent organization of Canadian Christian women committed to ecumenism, women's spiritual growth, social justice, and women's issues. The Council coordinates the Canadian celebration of World Day of Prayer, as well as the global prayer movement Fellowship of the Least Coin. Through its committees, the council is focused on issues of anti-racism, poverty, and ending violence against women, while connecting with other Christians working for justice across Canada.

World Day of Prayer services will be held across the Region. SJR will be participating in the **World Day of Prayer service at St. Anne's RC Church on East Avenue at 1:30pm on Friday, March 4th**. The women of Chile have written this service entitled "How Many Loaves Have You?" Everyone is invited to join in the Service and luncheon to follow.

Bible Study

The Wednesday Evening Bible Study will begin a seven week Lenten Study on Ash Wednesday, March 9th and conclude the study on the Wednesday of Holy Week, April 20th. We have chosen a study entitled "Hard to Dance with the Devil on Your Back" that looks at the struggle in the lives of believers while helping us enter the continually crumbling world surrounding Jesus and the disciples in the days preceding Easter. Each lesson includes a Scripture reference, a reflection, questions for reflection or discussion and a brief prayer. 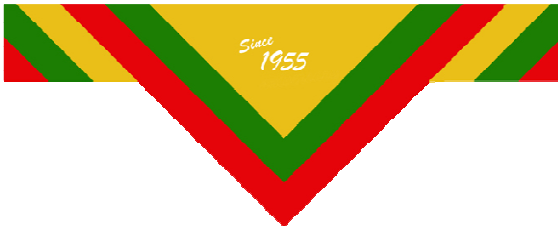
